Fund commentary

- Valuation discrepancies among alternative asset managers creates an opportunity to focus on Apollo
- Gaming holding Crown Resorts subject to a takeover bid

We exited our positions in alternative investment managers Ares and KKR and used the proceeds to increase our position in Apollo Global Management. Apollo announced an all-share transaction to acquire insurance company Athene. The transaction is earnings accretive – Apollo's share count will increase by roughly 30% but its earnings will rise ~70% – although admittedly insurance is a lower quality business with higher capital intensity and balance sheet risk. The market is grappling with how to value Apollo going forward, but we believe the shares are too cheap, trading on a low teens multiple, for a growing business of its quality.

We also exited our investment in payment network

Mastercard. Since our original purchase in October 2014, Mastercard has been one of the Fund's core positions and strongest performers. Mastercard remains an excellent business but we suspect earnings growth in the next five years may not be good as that over the past five. With interest rates inflecting upwards and Mastercard's valuation in the mid-30s price-to-earnings, we sold out of the position.

Our gaming holding, Australian-based Crown Resorts, was up ~18% over the month following a takeover offer from private equity firm Blackstone. Crown has been subject to significant noise around its licensing which distracted from the quality of its assets and the free cash flow potential post completion of the new Sydney resort.

Investment philosophy

We aim to build long term wealth together with our co-investors by finding and exploiting investment anomalies. Using a focused, patient and considered approach to finding simple investment ideas produces the best environment for creating that long term wealth.

Our experience has shown us that while the market is largely efficient, it can, and regularly does, misprice a small proportion of companies. This mispricing can arise as a result of any number of reasons, but is most often associated with disruptive or cyclical change, new information which is misunderstood by the market as having a permanent impact when it is in fact transitory, or just because they are operating in a sector out of favour with investors.

Our unique process is based on scanning the world for those companies (hence the radar in our logo), discovering the associated valuation anomalies and extracting value from them. We buy good businesses at a good price; businesses that we believe are being valued differently to their long term intrinsic value, but will return to their correct value over time.

Who manages the investment?

The Portfolio Manager for the Fund and CIO is Paul Moore. Paul is supported by a team of experienced investment analysts.

We believe in being a patient investor, one that has conviction, one that finds opportunities where others can only see risk. We only invest in what we know, deeply, via our fundamental research.

Why the Global **Companies Fund?**

Established: The Fund's process has been shown to be effective, based on a philosophy developed by Paul Moore, over 35 years. This has produced attractive long term capital growth.

Unrestricted: We have an authentic investment process where our exposure to industry sectors, geographic regions or market capitalisation is determined solely by our conviction in the risk/ reward opportunities that we identify within portfolio guidelines. No conviction = no investment.

Opportunistic and focused: The Fund is not built around a general market benchmark or index - it is highly focused based on our fundamental, bottom-up investment process. As a guide, the Fund holds around 25 - 45 deeply researched stocks that we believe give the best opportunity to produce strong long term

Co-investment: Our co-investors receive access to a unique subset of opportunities to which they would otherwise find difficult to access. The management team have significant investments in the Fund - they invest for and with you.

Outperformance: The Fund has outperformed the relevant market index by 407% since inception.1 The Fund is managed from an Australian investor's perspective with consideration for tax and currency outcomes.
