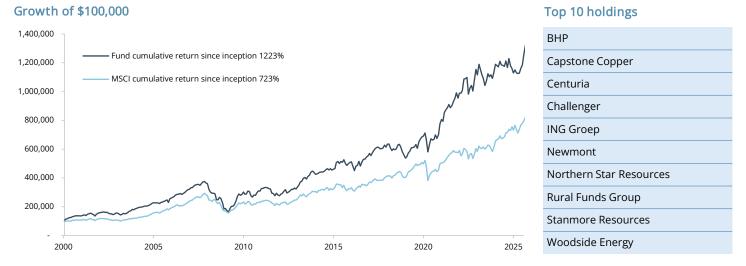

Fund commentary

The Australian equity market climbed in August, with the fund rising 4.7% and outpacing the ASX 200 Accumulation Index, which increased by 3.1%. Commodities continued to lead the Australian market, driven by a combination of stronger commodity prices and growing optimism about demand from China.

Performance for the fund was driven by standout performance across our commodities positions. **Mineral Resources** (up +31%) continued to recover on the back of a rebound in lithium prices, which were lifted by expectations of rising EV demand and a crackdown on mining in China, reducing production from one of the country's largest domestic lithium producers.

Capstone Copper rallied 27% after receiving all required permits to commence construction of its Mantoverde Optimiser project. The company also recently completed a debt refinancing program, meaning the project is now fully funded, allowing construction to begin this quarter. The \$176 million brownfield project will increase copper throughput by 40% and extend the Life-of-Mine to 25 years at Capstone's highest-quality asset, Mantoverde in Chile.

Newmont continued to rally, rising 16% in August after delivering a strong earnings update. The company generated record free cash flow during the period, supported by all-time-high gold prices. However, the stock still trades more than 10% below its previous 2022 peak, despite the gold price having nearly doubled since then.

Stanmore Resources was the largest drag on performance, declining 12% in August and reversing July's gains. Results from industry bellwether BHP highlighted the challenging metallurgical coal environment: BHP, traditionally the lowest-cost producer globally, reported that its Queensland coal business was also only marginally above breakeven for FY25. We remain positive on Stanmore and expect the stock to do well when the cycle eventually turns.

The fund sold its position in **GQG Partners** anticipating continued FUM outflows on the back of ongoing relative underperformance.

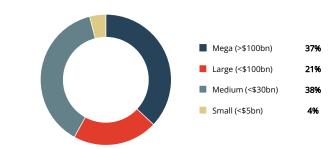
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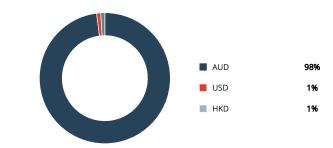
